I want to draw your attention to a unique opportunity to take BE5102 (OT History 1) or BE5405 (Exposition of Genesis) in a different venue and format. Dr. Brian Fisher, Dr. Pierre Cannings, and I will be team teaching Genesis this summer as a hybrid course at a beautiful retreat in the mountains of North Carolina. This retreat center is called The Cove – a teaching facility for the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association (BGEA). We will be teaching an intensive Bible training, which is open to the public.

Please be aware that there are limited scholarships for room and board and they are based on financial need.

If you are married, bring your spouse. He or she can sit in on the class with you. Of course, you still have to pay for room and board. It's a great opportunity to grow together.
